If your church has recently completed a background check on you, please have the church send us a letter here at Camp McCall on church stationary, stating that a favorable background check has been done. If a background check has **not** been done, please have your church do this ASAP. If your church does not have a background check policy in place, they may contact the company the South Carolina Baptist Convention uses for background checks.

****DO NOT MAIL COMPLETED BACKGROUND CHECK FORMS TO CAMP MCCALL OR THE SC BAPTIST CONVENTION****

Should an emergency arise that prevents you from accompanying your son/or group, the substitute adult **MUST** have a background check done. The substitute adult **MUST** bring a completed "background check" form **OR** a letter from your church **to camp** with them. "Emergency only" background checks will be done at Camp McCall for an additional cost of \$10.00 each. You can go to our website at www.scbaptist.org/campmccall and print out a background check form "for emergencies only" and bring to camp with you.

Dear Camper:

The McCall Staff looks forward to seeing you at Camp McCall this summer!

Registration for all camps begins at 9:00 a.m., and all campers must be registered by noon. During Lad Camps, campers will stay in the same cabin with all the boys and men from their church and the camp session will end on the third day after breakfast.

Use the *Clothing Guide* listed in the letter to help you and your parents/guardians to know what to take to camp. This can also be used as a checklist when you repack to return home. Please do not bring new clothing to camp. You will be sure to get dirty! It is also a good idea to label your clothing and personal items with your name so that you don't lose them. Our staff cannot be responsible for items left at camp. Closed toe shoes are recommended. Flip flops can be very dangerous at camp.

During camp, you will be given the chance to shop at the Camp Store, Craft Hut, and Canteen. We have t-shirts, hats, leather crafts, woodcrafts, RA racers, water bottles, toboggans, hackey sacks, flashlights, snacks, Gatorade, and more! Plus, all items are priced to where you can afford them, so every camper can go home with a McCall souvenir.

Camp McCall is so full of fun stuff that you don't even need to bring some of your own stuff. It is a camp policy that tobacco products are not allowed. We also do not permit outside food, cell phones, radios, iPods, pocket video games, or weapons of *any* kind. Please do not bring any of these with you to camp.

Very Important: ALL campers (LAD men *and* boys) will need to bring their completed **Health History Form** to camp with you for Registration. The boy's form must be signed by a parent/guardian. **The Health History does NOT have to be signed by a physician.**

If your parents need to relay a message to you, they can call the camp office at (864) 878-6025. Cell phones do not work in the mountains at camp.

We want you to know that we are doing everything possible to make your week at Camp McCall a fun, fulfilling and spiritually rewarding experience. Please pray for us as we plan for the summer. We look forward to a safe and meaningful camping season.

**NOTE: I-385 North is CLOSED for construction.
Follow detour signs. I-385 South is open.**

FROM COLUMBIA: Take I-26 to I-385 at Clinton. Proceed on I-385.
(Choose from one of the three options listed below.)

Option 1: Take I-185 toward Atlanta on the Toll Road. You will go through two toll booths (tolls vary according to vehicle). After the second toll both, take the first exit to Highway 153. Proceed on Highway 153 to Highway 123 South towards Easley. Bear right onto Highway 93/8 through Easley. You will be on Highway 8 towards Pickens. Turn left on Highway 183. Follow for two blocks and turn right on Highway 178. Camp McCall will be 14.5 miles on your left.

Option 2: Take I-385 to I-85 South. Proceed to exit 40 onto Highway 153. Turn right on Highway 153. You will go about 6 miles to Highway 123. Bear right on Highway 93. You will pick up Highway 93/8 to Easley. Take Highway 8 to Pickens. Turn left on Highway 183. Follow for two blocks and turn right on Highway 178. Camp McCall will be 14.5 miles on your left.

Option 3: Take I-385 into downtown Greenville past Bi-Lo Center which turns into Highway 183. Proceed on Highway 183 West out of Greenville to Pickens. Make a left at light at Amoco Station. Take right onto Highway 178. Cross over Highway 11 and go 5 miles. Camp McCall will be on your left.

FROM ANDERSON OR GREENWOOD: Take Highway 178 towards Pickens. Proceed on Highway 178. Camp McCall will be 14.5 miles on your left.

TRAVELING NORTH FROM SPARTANBURG: Take I-26 to Highway 11 to Highway 178. Take a right onto Highway 178. Camp McCall will be 5 miles on your left.

- ____ Other Clothing Items (Used clothing is best, because campers tend to get dirty during the day, and some campers accidentally leave things behind.)

- ____ Other Miscellaneous Items

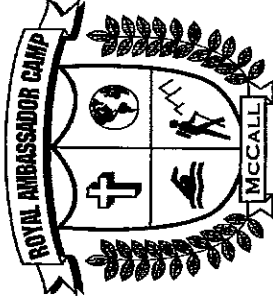

WELCOME!

We are so excited that your camper will be coming to Camp McCall this summer. We know that your camper is going to have a great time. Our highly trained staff, assisted by missionaries and pastors, will do everything possible to make sure that your camper remains safe and is challenged in a spiritual way during this awesome experience.

N. Clifton Satterwhite is the Administrative Camp Director at McCall. He holds a lifetime certification with the American Camp Association as a Certified Camp Director. He is fully trained in camp management and operation and has directed the camp since 1975. Eddie Pettit has served as Camp Manager-Director since 1994. Randy Vincent, who has been on staff since 1999, serves as Assistant Camp Director. BJ Pettit and Joan Penn serve as Camp Nurses. Camp McCall is accredited by The American Camp Association.

Here are some important notes to remember as you prepare your camper to attend Camp McCall this summer:

WHAT TO BRING

Please check the list on the back of this brochure for recommended items to bring.

Do not bring any of the following:

- food or drink
- cell phones, radios, GameBoys, iPods, etc.
- personal valuables (including valuable clothes/shoes)
- weapons of any kind
- tobacco products, alcohol

Each camper will need some spending money (as desired), for canteen snacks, camp store items such as camp t-shirts and hats, and craft hut items such as wood kits and leather crafts. Please send cash for spending money (no personal checks or credit cards). A camp bank is provided for Crusader/Challenger campers, and we require that they deposit their money for safekeeping. A camper can withdraw their bank money during specified periods of the day, and any remaining money in the account is returned to them at lunch on Friday.

CLOTHING

We recommend that you do not send new clothing/shoes to camp. Items often find themselves left or misplaced. Additionally, we recommend that shoes are closed-toed. We also recommend putting name tags in your camper's clothing, shoes, and miscellaneous belongings. Camp McCall is not responsible for items that are lost or left at camp. The "What To Bring To Camp" on the back page could serve as a possible checklist to help your camper keep up with his personal items while at camp and as he packs to return home at the end of the week.

HEALTH & HEALTH INSURANCE

It is very important that the enclosed health form is filled out completely and signed by a parent/guardian. **Your camper must have his completed health form with him when he arrives at camp.**

Camp McCall offers secondary health insurance coverage for the amount not covered by personal insurance. If a camper has no accident insurance, the camp insurance will assume responsibility for any accident occurring during his stay at camp.

CONTACTING CAMPERS

No personal visits are allowed at camp, and campers are not allowed to make or receive telephone calls. (Cell phones do not work at camp either.) This is best for short-term camping experiences like Camp McCall. We do encourage you to write a cheerful note to your camper while he is at camp (please no food packages though). Written mail should be sent to:

Crusader/Challenger campers may also receive e-mails at camp. To send e-mail, follow the instructions for Bunk1 camper mail that are enclosed in your confirmation packet. Bunk1 e-mails and regular mail are delivered to campers each day during mealtimes.

In the case of an emergency at camp, you will be called immediately. In the case of an emergency at home that would require you to contact your camper, call the Camp Office at (864) 878-6025 or Eddie Pettit at (864) 878-4123 (after office hours).

CAMPER CANCELLATIONS & SUBSTITUTIONS

Unless a doctor's excuse is provided, there are no refunds for camper cancellations. If your camper is registered for camp but unable to attend, we strongly encourage a camper substitution. Camper substitutions can be handled prior to or upon arrival at camp. Substitution campers must also have a completed health form upon their arrival at camp.

PICK-UP

Crusader/Challenger Camps end at 2 p.m. on Friday afternoon. Please do not come to the camp or arrange to have your camper leave before this time. This takes away from their overall camp experience. Crusader/Challenger campers can be picked up between 2 p.m. and 3 p.m. Camp will be closed for the weekend after 3 p.m. Transportation to and from camp is the responsibility of the parents/guardians.

Lad Camps end after breakfast on the third day of camp. Transportation to and from camp is the responsibility of the group leaders.
